WHAT IS IT?

A chain of friendship linking together the residents of the United States with foreign visitors who have come to study among them.

WHO MAY PARTICIPATE?

All students, trainees, and observers who have come to America from abroad, and who plan to return when their studies are completed.

WHAT DOES IT COST?

Nothing for internationals. Expenses are covered by contributions from the Americans who participate.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Thousands of families scattered throughout the country have joined hands to show friendship and hospitality to visitors from abroad. They receive

traveling students into their homes as overnight guests and seek to make their visit enjoyable and profitable in every community. Those who live near universities share their home and family life with interested internationals. Area directors of FOCUS plan activities at which foreign visitors may meet Americans, exchange ideas, visit farms, etc.

WHO SPONSORS IT?

FOCUS is sponsored by International Students, Inc. (ISI), a Christian organization supported by churches of all major denominations. The families who participate are enlisted through churches that are willing to cooperate with ISI. In addition to Focus, ISI sponsors many other projects. Among them are: an association for Christian Chinese students, an association for Christian students from Latin America, a hospital in Formosa, theological seminaries in Singapore and Tokyo, and a medical center in India.

HOW DO WE ENTER?

Simply write to the headquarters in Washington and ask to be introduced to cooperating Americans. Those who live in cities where branch offices are located should contact the Focus director there in order to be included in activities. If home hospitality is desired at stop-over points on a trip, requests should be submitted a month in advance. Friends coming from overseas will be met on arrival if you request it, and assisted with their travel plans.

THE SPONSORS BELIEVE

—in the Christian objective of peace on earth, good will to men; that better understanding among nations can be best achieved by person to person international friendships. ISI especially encourages the exchange of ideas and spiritual values between American Christians and the representatives of other great religions of the world.
